Renowned for the outstanding quality of its programs, and its capacity to bring inspiring Australian and international art to audiences, ACCA is a champion of new art and bold ideas, and a dynamic platform for current and future generations of artists, thinkers, enthusiasts and supporters of the visual arts. Based on the European model of the kunsthalle or 'exhibition hall', ACCA is, in its simplest form, a large shell for the display of contemporary art.
